In December 1521, the first revolt launched by enslaved people against their European captors took place in the Americas, on the plantation of Diego Colon, son of Christopher, in what is now the Dominican Republic. This rebellion was met with force by the Spanish colonialists, generating sweeping new racist laws and an age of terror. Very little has been written about this momentous occasion. It has gone largely ignored and minimally mentioned in historical narratives as well as other media and studies. This readation / performation constitutes an attempt at 'writing' the narrative.
